BURLEY INN TREE WORKS With the kind agreement of the owner of the Burley Inn, the Council has approved the quotation from a qualified tree surgeon for the removal of a sapling and higher branches obscuring the view of the flagpole from the War Memorial.

LITTER **Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> October** was confirmed as the date for the Parish Council's customary Autumn Litter Pick in and around the village, commencing at 2.30 p.m. outside Burley Primary School. Discussions are in hand for the involvement of members of local Scout and Youth of Burley groups on this occasion. Specific areas will be allocated to be covered by these volunteers but this will still leave plenty of scope for adults to join us, working on individually preferred areas for an hour or so in the usual way.
