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BURLEY EMERGENCY PLAN Cllr Thorpe and the Chairman are to meet with the new coordinator of the Emergency Plan before a full briefing of helpers is arranged.

NEW BROADBAND CABINET BT are proposing to install a new Broadband cabinet outside of the Burley Inn under General Development Rights without the need to obtain Planning Permission. Broadband speeds for 400 properties within 1200m of the new cabinet can expect to see improvement of up to 24MB once it has been installed. These improvements are due to take place as part of Phase 5, January-June 2015. Properties outside this area may see some improvement but are also to be included in the next improvement phase, date TBC.

ROADS AND TRAFFIC New posts have now been placed at previously damaged pinch points; we await the new road lines and cats eyes. Drainage issues in the village centre and in Bennetts Lane have been reported and are to be dealt with during the current checks. You may soon notice 3 replacement traffic signs at: Durmast crossroads, Mill Lane/Woods Corner and Lester Square. Castle Hill Lane improvement works have now been completed and a gate is in place to make it a no through road.

HEAVY GOODS VEHICLES An increase in HGVs coming through the centre of Burley has been noted; in previous years Cllr Kendall lead a team of residents, with the support of HCC, to tackle this issue. **Volunteers are requested** to join a group logging details of HGVs that are using the village as a rat run. The volunteer group will again be organised by Cllr Kendall so if you are able to help with this important safety issue please contact **Jane Kendall Tel: 402407**.

AIRCRAFT NOISE Aircraft originating from Bournemouth Airport continue to cause noise for residents of Burley. Please continue to raise your complaints direct with the airport's dedicated noise complaints service on 01202 364500. The strength of feeling on this issue can only be monitored by registering your complaints.

LITTER **Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> October** is the date for the Parish Council's customary Autumn Litter Pick in and around the village, commencing at 2.30 p.m. outside Burley Primary School. Discussions are in hand for the involvement of members of local Scout and Youth of Burley groups on this occasion. Specific areas will be allocated to be covered by these volunteers but this will still leave plenty of scope for adults to join us, working on individually preferred areas for an hour or so in the usual way. After a fine, busy summer there will be lots to collect so we shall need as many helpers as possible.

DEFIBRILLATOR The new Publically Accessible Defibrillator has now been delivered and it is hoped that it will be installed at the Village Hall w/c 21<sup>st</sup> September. A training session will then take place with representatives from BPC, the WI, Burley Business Association and the Church.
