BURLEY EMERGENCY PLAN Plan coordinator Tony Bracey is looking for more helpers to assist in their area of Burley. Burley has been divided into 18 areas and at least one helper (ideally 2) is needed in each to assist the emergency services in the case of an incident; one of the main aims would be to check on vulnerable people. ROADS AND TRAFFIC Cllr Martin reported that: cat's eyes at pinch points in Ringwood Road are now complete; Hants Highways have confirmed cycling on footpaths is an offence and can be reported to police; it is being investigated whether brown Sammy Miller Motorcycle museum signs can be removed as these result in more traffic being diverted through the village; a drainage hole outside Dawson's garage will be repaired and a new drain put in (along with another nearer the village); a project is underway to improve white lines into and through the village. A request has been put to BPC by the President of the golf club for a sign at the bottom of Queens Head hill towards the golf club, this is being investigated. Cllr Martin is also investigating the possibility of crossing points for pedestrians in the village; these would be defined with differing surface materials or colour rather than pedestrian crossings.

PLAY AREA Cllr Martin has met with Mr Dan Twyman, the new Head Teacher at Burley Primary School to explore the feasibility of a community play area. A possible site has been identified behind the school playground utilising adjoining woodland. This will be a community led project ... watch this space for further developments!

HGVs Cllr Kendall is in communication with HCC and arranging a meeting open to potential volunteers of this project. The project aims to track the movement of HGVs cutting through Burley village and follow this up with the companies involved, who are not making drops in Burley village. BOURNEMOUTH AIRPORT Cllrs Martin and Russell have attended meetings at Bournemouth Airport where it was reported that 650,000 passengers went through Bournemouth airport in 2014. 850,000 are expected in 2015 equating to 160 additional movements a week, this is reported to be less than in 2012. Burley was the highest complaining village; Cllr Martin has requested feedback from the airport on the nature of the complaints and how these were responded to. Issues will continue to be tracked through 2015 and fed back to Bournemouth Airport. DEFIBRILLATOR As you may be aware the defibrillator is now installed at the Village Hall. In the event of an emergency ring 999 and state the address of the defibrillator i.e. Village Hall, Pound Lane, Burley, BH24 4ED; the emergency service will then issue a code to allow access to the defibrillator box and further instructions will be given by the machine itself - anyone trained or otherwise will be able to use it. **However for those interested, a CPR and defibrillator training session will be given on Monday 12th January at 6.30pm in Myrtle Hall.** Anyone interested in attending should contact Cllr Jane Kendall on Tel: 402407 for more details.
