PUBLIC PARTICIPATION Residents of Coach Hill Lane were present to discuss arrangements for the Hearing of the Appeal against the Refusal to grant planning permission for the further extension of Gorselands Nursing Home. WETLAND RESTORATION PROGRAMME (Harvestslade Bottom) It was reported that Natural England, the Forestry Commission and the Verderers have been asked to make a joint presentation on the current Wetland Restoration Programme to the next meeting of the New Forest Consultative Panel on Thursday, 3rd September. Interested Parish Councils & other organisations are to be able to respond to this presentation with their own observations. Burley Parish is now at the forefront of this Programme since the Harvestslade Bottom project is due to start at the end of August. This is in pursuance of the grant of Planning Permission to the Forestry Commission in October last year (despite

strong local concerns about such works that are intended to encourage more regular flooding etc. of the ancient mires of the Forest). In view of Burley's current position within the programme, Cllr. Clarke (B.P.C.'s Panel representative) has been asked to lead the Parish Councils' response.

TAXISHARE Burley's bus service may cease in September if it proves to be unprofitable for the current provider. A Taxi Share scheme is run by Hampshire County Council. If you are interested in using this service and require more information please contact Cllr Jane Kendall on 402407.

- Signs at the pinch points between Burley and Bransgore have been deliberately bent. These have been referred to Hampshire Highways for action.
- Please note: diversion signs in and around Burley have been placed by the Highway Agency as part of the work being undertaken on the A31. The diversion signs will be removed once the work has been completed.
- The layby in Pound Lane has been requested for repair and is on the Hampshire Highways job list.
