BURLEY CHARITIES BPC appoints a Trustee to "Burley Charities". As such Mr Paul Holdsworth spoke to BPC about the origins of "Burley Charities" and its current work. Burley Charities is derived from the amalgamation of 5 other charities/trust benefactors dating back 300 years and administers a small capital investment. Burley Charities meets twice a year and in December 2015 forty five individuals/households were contacted when Christmas cards, plants or food vouchers were distributed. Burley Charities can also help families or individuals in difficulty with a one-off donation; benefactors must live in the village to benefit.

ROADS AND TRAFFIC You may have noticed that road markings have now been painted on the road in the centre of the village, following the new footpath installation. Thank you to all those that have given positive feedback about the new footpath! Potholes around the village have also now been temporarily repaired. Cllr Martin is in communication with Hampshire Highways regarding the path outside the Post Office, which is also in need of repair.

BURLEY STREET NOTICEBOARD As previously reported a new noticeboard is soon to be installed at Burley Street (by the westbound bus stop); it is hoped that this will be completed by the end of April. The noticeboard will display Parish Council notices such

as Agendas and local event information so that residents of Burley Street have access to this information without the need to travel to the village centre.
