<u>GRANT</u> BPC has given a grant of £175 to the Community First Responders towards the purchase of a Pulse Oximeter which is used to assess each patient that is attended by them.

<u>ROADS AND TRAFFIC</u> As you may already be aware the A338 is now fully reopened; coordination and information from Dorset Highways has been very good throughout the project. A survey by Hampshire Highways will assess the edge of Forest Road and filling in of the holes with hoggin is expected to be carried out.

BURLEY HERITAGE The NFNPA Resources, Audit and Performance committee has agreed in principle to proceed with a planning application for two affordable houses and a heritage centre on land identified in the centre of Burley. A public consultation will be held in conjunction with BPC when there are firm design plans in place. Further discussions between NFNPA and BPC will be held to determine the terms of any agreement and the exact dimensions of the land available for a Heritage Centre. It is currently proposed that a Heritage Trust will run the proposed Heritage Centre with representatives from BPC on the committee.

<u>BURLEY STREET NOTICEBOARD</u> As you may have noticed the new noticeboard in Burley Street is now up and in use with BPC and relevant local information. The Clerk and Cllr Johnstone are key holders for the noticeboard.
