ROADS AND TRAFFIC You may have already noticed that the speed limit on Holmsley bridge has now been reduced from 60mph to 40mph and barriers will be installed on the verges to keep vehicles on the main carriageway. HCC continues to monitor the bridge which will eventually require replacement.

LENGTHSMAN Burley's new Lengthsman has been working on a variety of jobs around the village. The bench seats are a particular focus at the moment and maintenance work is underway; some are in a very poor condition and therefore replacement seats are being considered. AFFORDABLE HOUSING BPC is currently awaiting completion of the purchase of land in the centre of the village, between the NFNPA and the vendor. This may in future lead to some provision of affordable housing for local essential workers. We will keep you updated on any developments.

ANIMAL CASUALTIES It is lovely to see foals gambolling around at this time of year however it is important that residents and visitors alike are reminded that feeding the animals only encourages them closer to the danger of roads and can result in colic as well as the possibility of people being kicked or bitten.
