GDPR As you are no doubt aware the new General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) comes into force on 25th May this year. POUND LANE SAPLINGS BPC has agreed a tree management company to plant saplings in Pound Lane following the removal of dead and diseased trees in Pound Lane last year. The Forestry Commission will be supplying the UK sourced saplings free of charge and it is hoped that planting will take place by the end of May.

BURLEY WAR MEMORIAL Following detailed research, it has been identified that several service personnel, with links to Burley and who perished in the two world wars,

have not had their names remembered on our War Memorial. A joint project between Burley Parish Council and the Burley Branch of the Royal British Legion has been established to verify the names, obtain the necessary permissions and to raise some money through the community. It is anticipated that we will need to raise in the region of £10,000 to fund the project. Stone Masons will then need to be commissioned to undertake the work. The project is underway and further details of the fund-raising activities will be published as we move forward.

LENGTHSMAN HCC funding for the Lengthsman scheme has again been approved for the year. This month the Lengthsman will undertake to clear around and clean the milestones in Burley - using the recommended process of soft brushes and water.
